HSS LOTTERY (for 2018-19-I Semester) Allotment of HSS level - I and level - II courses

HSS Department will conduct a manual lottery based allotment of courses for the upcoming (2018-19-I) semester. Students are hereby advised to fill out 'preference forms' indicating sufficient choices of courses.

PLEASE DROP FILLED IN FORMS IN THE DESIGNATED DROP BOXES KEPT OUTSIDE HSS OFFICE. DROP BOXES WILL BE AVAILABLE ON 9TH AND 10TH OF APRIL, 2018 BETWEEN 10 AM AND 5 PM.

Last date and time to drop the filled in forms in the drop box is Tuesday, 10th of April, 2018 by 5:00 PM. No forms will be accepted beyond this date and time.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

- 1) You should apply for HSS Courses only if you are eligible to apply for the same. Eligibility criteria is detailed below for your reference:
 - (a) HSS Level – I or II course is due for next semester as per your course template; or
 - (b) You have a Fail backlog in HSS Level – I or level – II course; or
 - (c) You have a Fresh backlog in HSS Level – I or level – II course.

There is no other criteria by which you can get a HSS course. However, if you wish to do an HSS course as OE or otherwise, then you can request for the same during normal pre-registration or add/drop period through Pingala.

- 2) Students are advised to give maximum possible preferences for HSS courses. If sufficient choices of courses are not provided, DUGC, HSS will allot courses as per availability of seats and courses.

Under no circumstances, the timings of the HSS courses will be changed. Hence, it is your responsibility to choose the courses carefully so that there is no time-clash with other courses you are planning to register for next semester.

- 3) A student cannot make request for the course(s) in which s/he has obtained a passing grade.
- 4) The allotment of the courses will be done through lottery. Hence, there is no guarantee that students will get only their most preferred courses.
