**Abstract**

The talk shall cover some basics of science, technology and environment journalism - what do these terms mean, what do the professional science/technology journalists do, why is this field gaining importance, what is their present status and the challenges that exist in this field in India and abroad, opportunities for science/engineering graduates in this field to pursue higher studies and/or career, and a glimpse of the bright future of this field in next decade.
