STATUTES OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR EARTHQUAKE ENGINEERING

Approved by the General Assembly of Delegates, January 30, 1965.

Art.1 NAME

(3)

1-1 This Organization shall be known as the "International Association for Earthquake Engineering" (hereinafter referred to as the "Association"). The initials IAEE may be used as the abbreviated name of the Association.

Art.? OBJECTS

- 2-1 The objects of the Association shall be to promote international cooperation among scientists and engineers in the field of earthquake engineering, through interchange of knowledge, ideas, and results of research and practical experience.
- 2-2 The Association will accomplish its objects by:
 - (a) holding world conferences,
 - (b) interchanging information, and
 - (c) extending technical cooperation.

Art.3 MEMBERSHIP

- 3-1 Membership in the Association shall be National Committees on Earthquake Engineering, or equivalent, with one such committee (hereinafter referred to as "National Committee") from each country interested in the subject of earthquake engineering.
- 3-2 A National Committee shall have representation from the scientific and engineering organizations interested in earthquake engineering in the country, and this National Committee shall designate a Delegate and a Deputy Delegate to represent it in the Association.
- 3-3 Where no National Committee exists, individual membership may be temporarily acquared by any person interested in earthquake engineering, provided that ne posseses the requisite scientific and technical knowledge.

Art.4 ADMINISTRATION

4-1 The administrative authority of the Association shall be exercised by:

- (a) The General Assembly of Delegates
- (b) The Executive Committee
- (c) The Officers

Art.5 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF DELEGATES

- 5-1 The General Assembly of Delegates shall be composed of all Delegates representing National Committees affiliated with the Association. The Deputy Delegate shall represent the National Committee in the absence of the Delegate from sessions of the General Assembly.
- 5-2 The sessions of the General Assembly of Delegates shall be presided over by the President of the Association.
- 5-3 The functions of the General Assembly of Delegates shall be:
 - (a) to elect a President, an Executive Vice-President, and Directors.
 - (b) to confirm recommendations for Honorary Fellows of the Association,
 - (c) to select date and place of world conferences.
 - (d) to establish policy and procedure,
 - (e) to consider any other matters affecting the Association,
 - (f) to revise these Statutes, as may be needed.
- 5-4 A session of the General Assembly of Delegates shall be held during each world conference.
- 5-5 At sessions of the General Assembly of Delegates, a majority vote of the Delegates present shall be required on all matters put to vote, unless otherwise provided for in the Statutes.
- 5-6 For matters requiring interim action by the General Assembly of Delegates, decision may be taken by postal ballot. This will require a majority of votes cast for adoption, with the total vote cast at least half of the eligible votes, except as required by 11-1.

Art.6 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 6-1 The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Executive Vice-President, other Vice-President, not more than eight Directors, the Secretary-General, and the Secretary.
- 6-2 The Secretary-General shall be nominated by the National Committee of the country where the central office of the Association is located, and shall be confirmed by the Executive Committee.

- 6-3 The Secretary shall be appointed by the President and confirmed by the Executive Committee.
- At least one of the Officers or Directors shall be elected from the country in which the next world conference is to be held.

 Not more than three members of the Executive Committee shall be from any one country. When the Executive Vice-President is not from the country selected to hold the next world conference, the President, after consulting the National Delegate of that country shall name an additional Vice-President from that country.
- 6-5 Officers and Directors shall be eligible for re-election or re-appointment.
- 6-6 The President shall be Chairman of the Executive Committee.
- 6-7 The functions of the Executive Committee shall be:
 - (a) to carry out the decisions and policies established by the General Assembly of Delegates,
 - (b) to decide on admissions and withdrawals from the Association,
 - (c) to assist the National Committee in the host country in the planning of the next world conference.
 - (d) to make recommendations to the General Assembly of Delegates for its action either in session or by postal ballot.
 - (e) to fill any vacancy in the Officers that may occur between world conferences.
- 6-8 The Executive Committee snall meet during each world conference.
- 6-9 During the interval between world conferences, the Executive Committee shall function through correspondence.
- 6-10 The provision of 5-5, 5-6, and 11-1 shall apply mutatis mutandis to the voting of the Executive Committee.

Art.7 OFFICERS

7-1 The Officers of the Association shall be:

The Executive Vice-President

The Secretary-General

The Secretary

- 7-2 The functions of the President shall be:
 - (a) to preside at meetings of the Executive Committee and at sessions of the General Assembly of Delegates.

- (b) to act on behalf of the Association in the conduct of the affairs of the Association in accordance with policies and procedures adopted by the General Assembly of Delegates.
- 7-3 The function of the Executive Vice-President shall be to assume the duties of the President in case the President is unavailable.
- 7-4 The functions of the Secretary-General shall be:
 - (a) to administer the central office of the Association,
 - (b) to maintain the records of the Association,
 - (c) to print and distribute publications of the Association,
 - (d) to keep in trust the money contributed to the Association and to provide an Annual Accounting of the Association funds.
- 7-5 The functions of the Secretary shall be to conduct the correspondence necessary to the affairs of the Association.
- Art.8 HONORARY FELLOWS
 - 8-1 Honorary Fellows shall be selected on the basis of their distinguished service to earthquake engineering.
 - 8-2 The Executive Committee shall nominate Honorary Fellows, to be confirmed by the General Assembly of Delegates.
- Art.9 FINANCES
 - 9-1 There shall be no dues nor assessments to member National Committees of the Association.
 - 9-2 Operating expenses of the central office of the Association shall be met by the National Committee in the country in which the central office is located.
 - 9-3 Each National Committee shall be responsible for meeting its own expenses.
 - 9-4 Expenses of a world conference shall be met by the host country.
 - 9-5 The foregoing shall not preclude any member National Committee from voluntarily contributing to the funds of the Association or to the organizing expenses of a world conference.
- Art.10 GENERAL
 - 10-1 The central office of the Association shall be located in the country determined by the General Assembly of Delegates.

10-2 The official language of the Association shall be English.

Art.11 AMENDMENTS

Adoption of any amendment to the Statutes shall require two-thirds affirmative vote of the Delegates present at a session of the General Assembly of Delegates; or two-thirds affirmative vote of the Delegates by postal ballot, provided the postal vote cast shall not be less than two-thirds of the eligible votes.
