

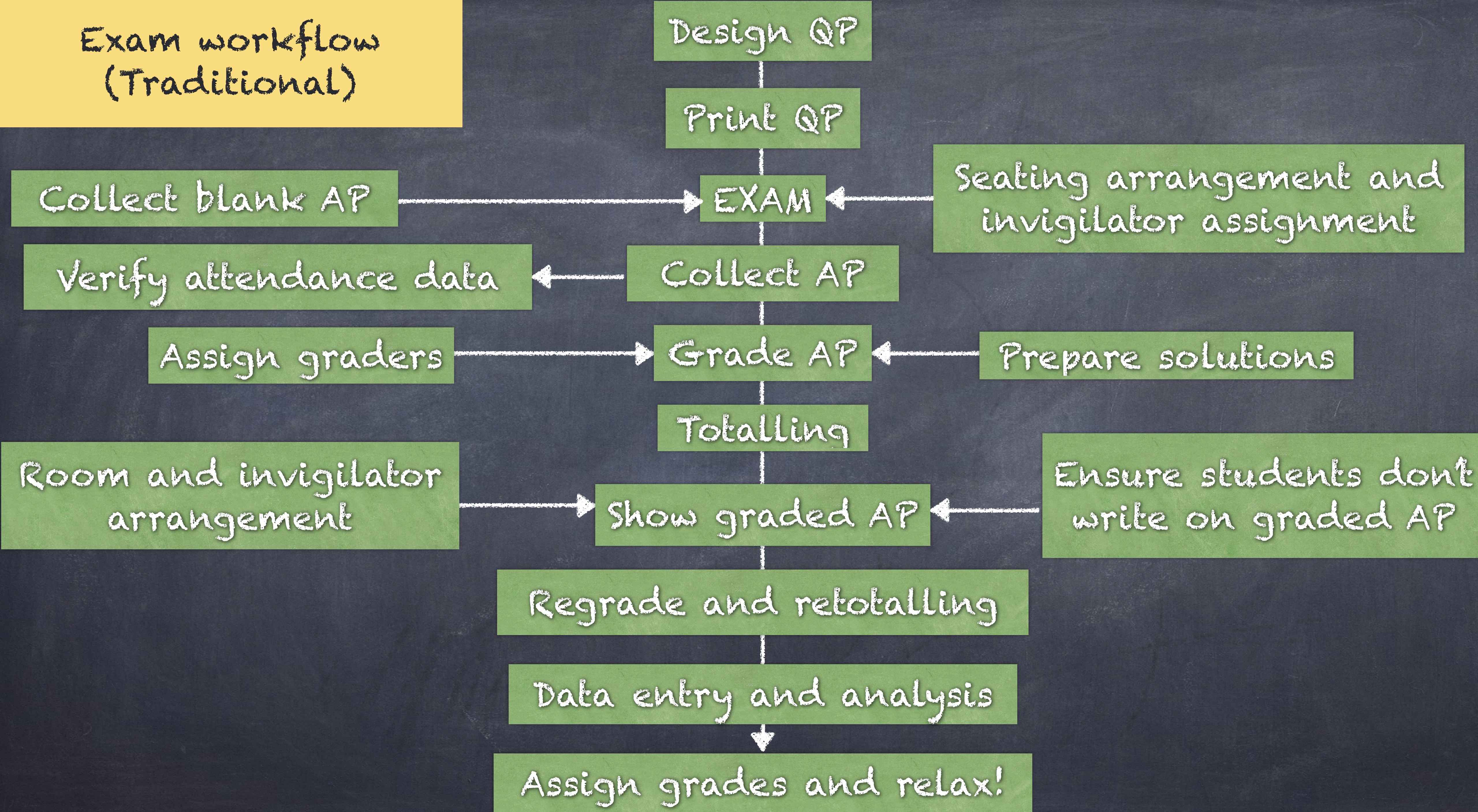

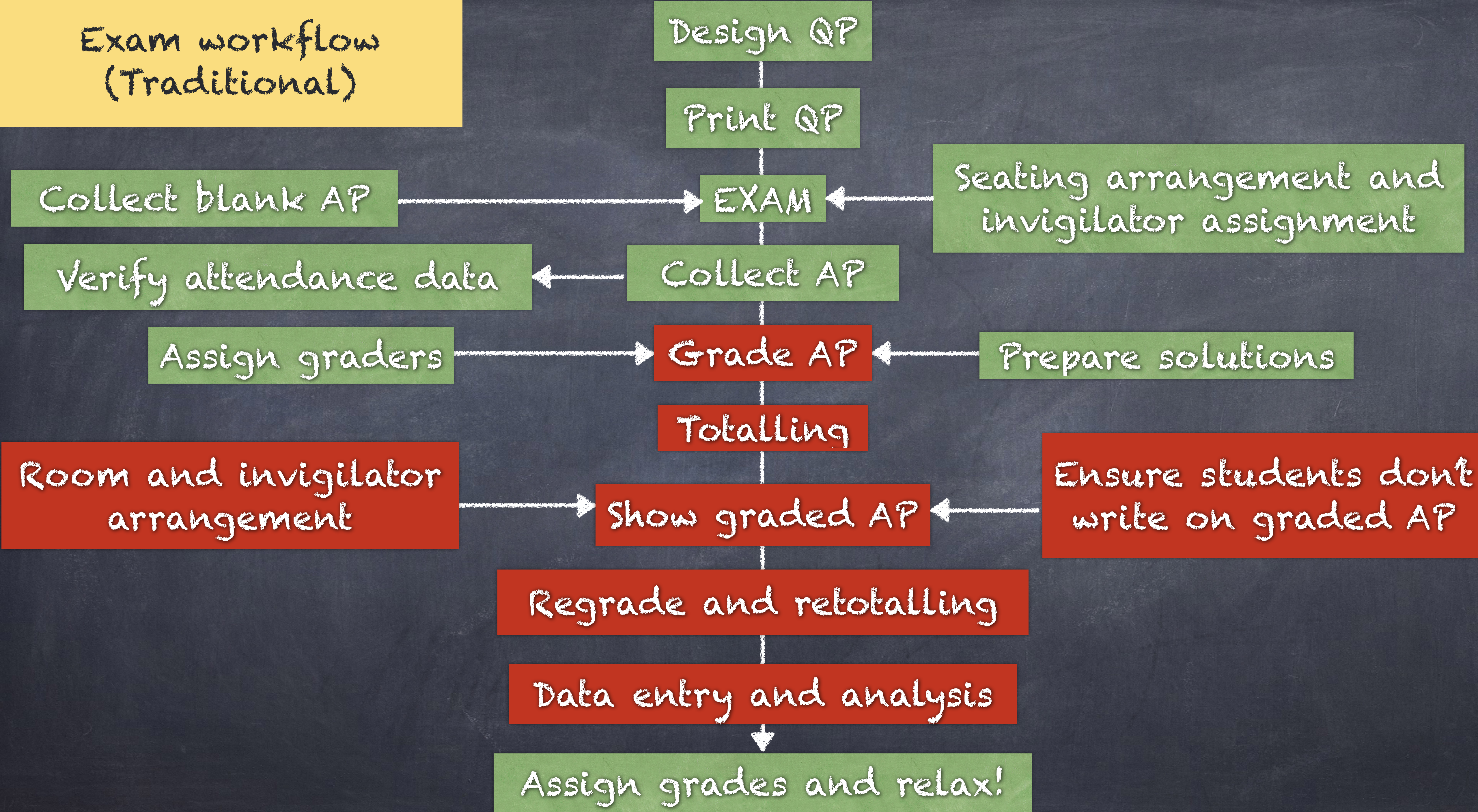

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- Chaos and cheating while showing graded copies/on-the-spot regrading

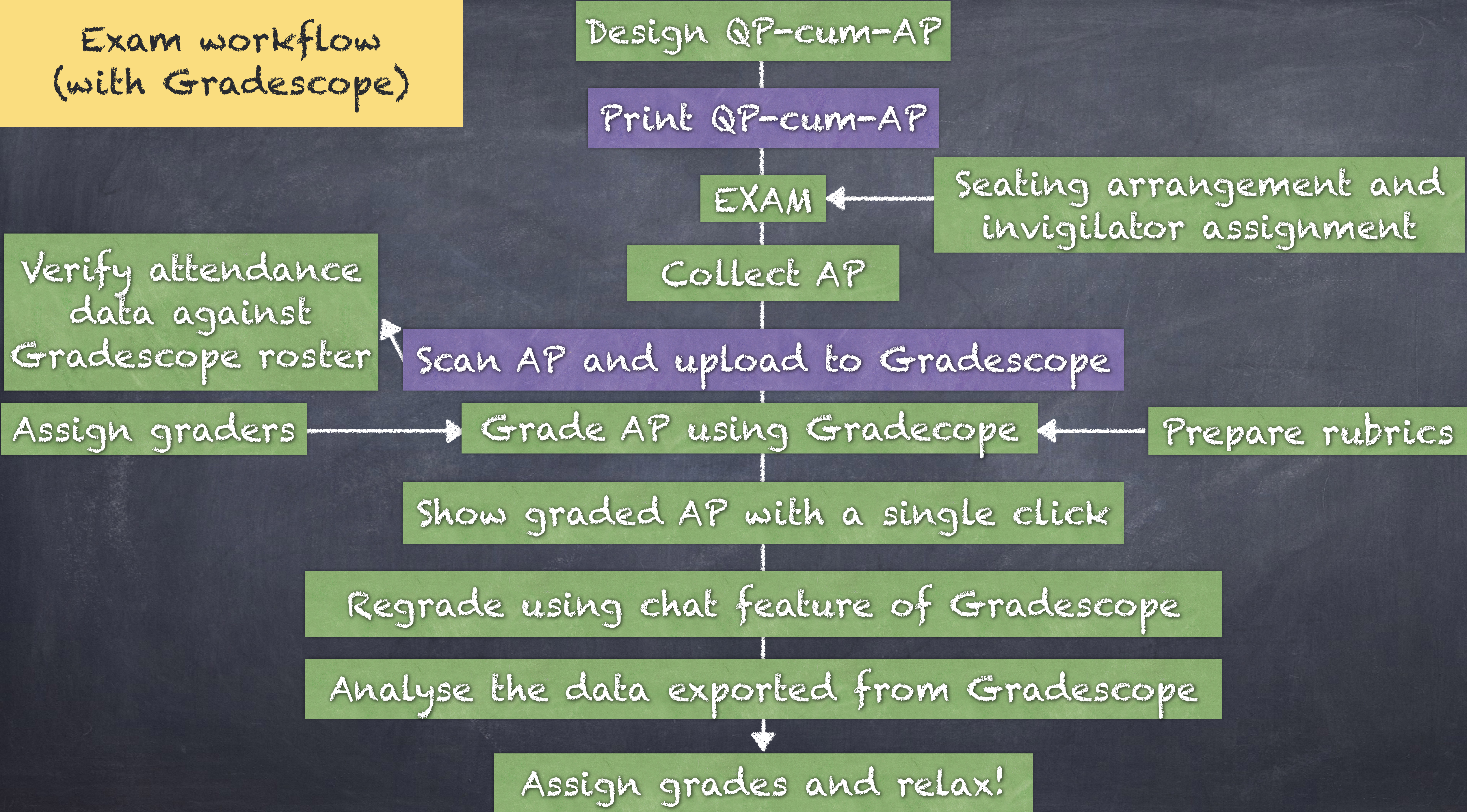
Gradescope: features

- Grade from any location with good internet!
- 100% transparency for graders and students
- Eco-friendly: saves paper
- Easy search and filter options
- Tablet and pencil-friendly
- Easy to switch between different copies
- Answer-grouping and group-grading

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- Answer-grouping and group-grading
- Dedicated question-specific view
- Skip a copy to return to it in the future
- Keyboard enough for grading most copies
- Automatic totalling
- Reuse previously written comments
- Auto-grading of MCQs
- Submission-specific point adjustment

Gradescope: challenges and solutions

- Increased screen time: what can we do in this era?!
- Essentially similar rights for Instructors and TAs: we believe in the integrity of our TAs
- Rubric structure lacks Boolean operations: Gradescope needs to be informed about this need
- Limited space for writing answers: break questions into parts
- (Re)ⁿ-grading queries from students for $n > 1$: instructor-in-charge should be strict

Also worth to discuss...

- Selection of paper: A4 or A3, and staples
- Variable length submissions
- Students can submit assignments
- Coding assignments and their grading
- Economic seating arrangement (OROS+ERES)
- Different QP sets to curb cheating
- Break an exam into 2-3 exams
